Sure to delight audiences of all ages, this show-stopping production will finish the 2008 Season on a high note.

The jungle will be jumpin' with jive in the bright and bouncy Family Theatre treat, Disney's *The Jungle Book* (August 6 – 17), inspired by the classic Rudyard Kipling stories and based on the beloved Walt Disney film.
